LANDER UNIVERSITY JUNIOR FELLOWS	To be considered for this award, students should rank in the top 20 percent of their junior class, and score a minimum of 25 on the ACT, or 1200 on the new SAT or PSAT and have at least a 3.5 GPA, and exemplify leadership in both academics and co-curricular activities. These students are Sam Brenn, Brady Crider, Peyton Inabinet, and Cate Williams.
PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE FELLOWS AWARD	Presbyterian College Fellows Award recognizes high school juniors who have demonstrated superior academic achievement and potential for future success. The \$4,000 scholarship awards \$1,000 annually for four years of study at Presbyterian College. These students must meet two of the following criteria: One or more of the following test scores: PSAT score of 1100 or higher, SAT score of 1100 or higher, ACT Composite score of 22 or higher, must be ranked in the top 10 percent of the current junior class, or have an unweighted GPA of 3.5 or more.
