Eleven students are being recognized by the South Carolina Independent School Association as SCISA Honor Graduates for having scored at least 1100 on the SAT or 24 on the ACT while obtaining a 3.5 grade point average or higher for each of seven semesters. Fifteen students are graduating with high honors which means they have a cumulative grade point average of 4.0 or higher.

Furthermore, Orangeburg Prep has one student receiving the Palmetto Fellows Award. To receive the Palmetto Fellows Award, a student must score at least 1200 on the SAT or 25 on the ACT, earn a cumulative 3.5 GPA or higher, and rank in the top six percent of their class. A student who is not in the top six percent of his/her class may earn the Palmetto Fellows Award by scoring either 1400 on the SAT or 31 on the ACT and earn a cumulative 4.0 GPA or higher.



These bills are aimed at addressing workforce shortages, student debt issues, and insurance accountability.




