Academic Signing Day was held April 22nd, 2019. Fifty-nine seniors signed to commit to twenty four different colleges and The United States Coast Guard. We are excited about what the future holds for our future alumni!



We congratulate our 59 seniors on their accomplishments!

Twenty-seven students are being recognized by the South Carolina Independent School Association as SCISA Honor Graduates for having scored at least 1100 on the SAT and obtaining a 3.5 grade point average for each of seven semesters. And, **41** students are graduating with high honors which mean they have a cumulative grade point average of 4.0 or higher. Furthermore, Orangeburg Prep has **4** students receiving the Palmetto Fellows Award. To receive the Palmetto a student must score at least 1200 on the SAT or 27 on the ACT, earn a cumulative 3.5 GPA, and rank in the top six percent of their class. A student who is not in the top six percent of his/her class may earn the Palmetto by scoring either 1400 on the SAT or 32 on the ACT and earn a cumulative 4.0 GPA. Among colleges and universities that our graduates will attend are Anderson University, Charleston Southern University, Clemson University, Clemson University, Bridge Program, College of Charleston, Georgia Southern University, Lander University, Lander University Beaver Campus, Presbyterian College, Savannah College of Art and Design, Southern Wesleyan University, The Citadel, The Citadel Honors Program, The University of Georgia, The University of South Carolina, The University of South Carolina Honors College. We also have one student who will be joining the United State Coast Guard.






