Follow 2 or 3 step directions.

Identify 5 vowels.

Know all uppercase letters and most lowercase letters.

Know some of the letter sounds.

Write his /her first name.

Recognize his/her first name.

Know the letters in his/her first name.

Recognize print as a (letter), (word), or (sentence).

Recognize the eight colors.

Hear the beginning sounds of some words.

Speak in complete sentences.

Recite a familiar rhyme.

Tell a story about a picture.

State his/her birthday.

Show two words that rhyme.

Identify numbers 0-12.

Write numbers 0-12 from memory.

Rote count at least from 1-12.

Know plane shapes.

Understand most positional words.
