SENIOR PRIVILEGES 2016-2017



**The following are a privilege and may be revoked at any time.*

1. Seniors will be dismissed first to leave when assemblies are completed.
2. Senior tables are at the front in the canteen. Seniors are allowed to order their food first.
3. Seniors do not have lunchroom cleanup duty, but will have cleanup in the biology lab and courtyard.
4. Seniors may eat lunch in the **canteen** or in the **senior courtyard** as long as all trash is cleaned up. During inclement weather, seniors eat in the canteen. Seniors are to use the microwaves in the canteen. The teachers' lounge in Building A is not available for student use.
5. Only seniors as a homeroom class may order food to be brought in on Fridays. Food will be brought in by a parent(s) only. All food must be brought on campus by the parent(s), and given to the seniors in the courtyard area. No seniors are allowed in the parking lot area. This privilege will be revoked if abused. **Seniors may not leave to go get lunch orders.** Students are not to use the microwave in the **home economics room** nor get eating utensils from the home economics room or the teachers' lounge.
6. Parking lot - first two lines of parking lot are reserved for seniors. Seniors must display the OPS parking decals. The first eight spaces on the hill are reserved for senior class and Student Body officers.
7. Seniors are allowed two official college visits during the first semester. Documentation from the college must be provided to Student Services within two days upon returning to school in order to excuse the absence. College visits taken during second semester must be approved by the Head of School.
8. Seniors who are enrolled in two dual-credit classes each semester will be allowed to leave school at 2:10 p.m. provided they are eligible. Seniors must have a passing average in ALL courses (dual-credit included) as well as have parental permission in order to be eligible to leave school at 2:10 p.m. Seniors who are failing a subject at the end of the nine weeks must report to the academic study hall during the seventh period and remain at school until 2:43 p.m. Monday through Thursday until the end of the grading period. If at the end of the grading period the senior is passing all subjects, he/she may resume early dismissal privileges.
9. Lockers—The senior class officers and Student Council officers have priority in choosing lockers. All other seniors will be assigned a locker numerically in alphabetical order of last name.
10. Exam Exemptions (Please refer to the OPS Family Handbook.)

TREY NOLL GARDEN/COURTYARD GUIDELINES

Seniors will have use of the Trey Noll Garden/Senior Courtyard during lunch provided they follow the guidelines.

1. Seniors must maintain a passing grade in EACH SUBJECT each nine weeks.
2. While in the garden/courtyard, Seniors are expected to sit quietly. There will be NO games - frisbees, electronic equipment, sunbathing, etc. **Noise must be kept at a minimum. No lying down or sitting on tables in the courtyard.**
3. Seniors are not allowed to go to the garden/courtyard during a subject class unless accompanied by a teacher for a class assignment. Please observe this rule.

Use of the garden/courtyard is a privilege. Any abuse during any period, including lunch, may result in the loss of the garden/courtyard for those abusing the privilege. Any complaints from teachers concerning noise, distracting behavior, or trash may result in the privilege being revoked for **all seniors**.
